Beach Access Points

PIE provides our island community with 13 PIE beach access points which are exclusive to all Palm Island property owners and their guests. These access points are owned by PIE and maintained by PIE annual dues. There are 5 public beach access points, 2 on S. Gulf and 3 N. Gulf. This is required by the county to enable our beaches to receive beach renourishment funding. The beach that extends from Stump Pass to Don Pedro Park, from the water edge to the erosion control line, is public beach. This includes the beach that borders Palm Island Resort; however, that area of the beach cannot be accessed from within the resort.

Pets are welcome on the island beaches but must always be on a leash. Please be sure and clean up after your pets when visiting the beach. For those who may forget to bring their own doggie disposal bags, PIE & BICI have you covered at the Public Access Points between 5 & 6 on S. Gulf and 9 & 10 on N. Gulf. Don't forget to grab your furry friend a treat while you're there!

Please remind friends and family to remove trash from the beach. This is not a public beach, there is no paid service for beach cleanup. It is up to us as home owners to insure our public spaces remain free of trash. There are no trash receptacles located at the beach.



7 Palm Island Estates (PIOE), 3 Public







6. Make a stop at the **Creative Kindness Rock Garden**, created by our own island kids...near Beach Access 13. Take a rock; leave a rock and smile!




